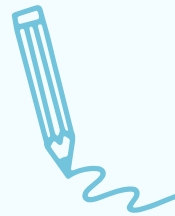
How It Works



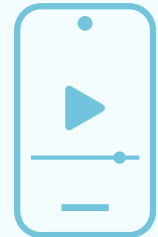
Choose any Times article, essay, image, graph, video or podcast episode published in 2024.

Contest Rules

- The contest is open to students ages 13 to 19 in middle or high school anywhere in the world.
- You can choose anything you like that was published in the print paper or on NYTimes.com in 2024.
- You can participate any or every week, but we only allow one submission per person per week.
- Written responses must be 1,500 characters (about 250 words) or fewer; video responses must be 90 seconds or fewer.
- Provide the complete URL or headline of the article you choose in your response.
- Deadline: Every Friday from June 14 to Aug. 16 at 9 a.m. Eastern.
